### <u>Summary</u>

FES New York's 2017 Summer Academy will allow FES Partners to explore the UN's Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development to use in their own progressive, transformative politics. Participants will be encouraged to look at the SDGs as a tool that has the potential to revitalize democracy and foster conversation between governments and civil society. Summer Academy participants will develop skills to influence the political agenda associated with the implementation and follow-up of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the participants' respective home countries. As part of this, they will look at the so-called Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs), which many UN Member States are currently undergoing to show their commitment to the SDGs. Participants will reflect on the dynamics of global and national level politics and how they can use governments' accountability towards the SDGs for their own progressive political agenda. Participants will collaborate on different topics (e.g. gender equality, decent work for all, consumption, climate change) in order to share expertise and learn from one another's experience. At the end of the Summer Academy, all participants will be asked to develop individual policy papers to help create a synergy between their ongoing work for progressive political transformation and the implementation of the SDG agenda in their home countries.
